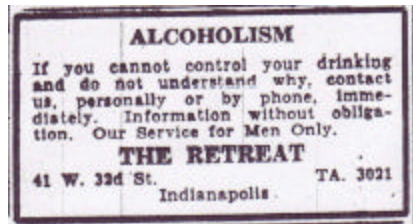

Something New!

Here is a new approach to a possible means of reformation of a City Court defendant. If it works, Judge C. M. Pieroni (a legally blind person) may adopt the plan. It should be added, the announced procedure is one developed solely by the judge and not at the instigation of newspapers Earl Crouch, liberated November 9, when 60 days sentence imposed in addition to a fine, was suspended on a public intoxication charge, was in court again yesterday. He had been "drunk again" his wife said, but she didn't want him required to serve out the suspended sentence. At the same time Mrs. Crouch insists her husband should abstain from use of intoxicants. Sent back to jail, Crouch was informed, he must advertise a plea, accompanied by a Picture of himself, urging tavern keepers and attendants not to sell him intoxicants. Until you do that, Judge Pieroni told the defendant, you will not get out of jail. He must meet the expense of the public plea.
